## An introduction from Mark Winnington

***The holiday period has been a time of considerable activity for the Superfast Staffordshire project, with much to report on in this issue.***

This newsletter contains information about the number of homes passed by the Superfast Staffordshire project and the numerous cabinets that have gone live in Rugeley, Colton, Blackshaw Moor and other parts of the County.

We have two business assist programmes running including one, specifically targeted at women – see inside for further information.

Whilst many people are confident at using the internet and all that it has to offer, many people can feel confused and isolated by the way information and services are bought and communicated. We are therefore very grateful to the people who give up their time to help their community overcome such difficulties. ## An Update from Openreach

***Openreach is the network division of BT Group responsible for the planning and delivery of the new fibre network.***

After a lot of hard work and planning we're very pleased to report that we rolled out high speed fibre broadband to 7,111 homes and businesses between April and June, exceeding our initial target.

We now estimate the total number of homes passed to be around 12,000, with the figure rising all the time!!

In Rugeley, 30 new fibre broadband cabinets are now live and ready to take orders from people wanting to upgrade. In total, the Rugeley area has accounted for approximately 5,350 of the total homes passed. Take a look below for more information.

## 30 New Cabinets for Rugeley

*Rugeley and Colton have become the latest communities to benefit from the Superfast Staffordshire programme.*

An additional 5,350 premises in the Rugeley area now have access to faster fibre broadband as a result of the project. Openreach engineers had to work across a deep water stream off Bellamour Way and overcome other challenges in order to lay the 13km of fibre optic cable needed to connect more than 250 homes and businesses in Colton onto the new network.

An additional 23km of fibre optic cable has been laid in Rugeley itself and 30 new street-side fibre cabinets have been installed so far, which will enable local people to access fibre broadband. Work in the town centre was coordinated with the Council's highways department to minimise disruption to local traders, residents and motorists in the Horse Fair area.

## Focus on the Moorlands - Blackshaw Moor

*The village of Blackshaw Moor has become one of the first communities in the Staffordshire Moorlands to benefit from the Superfast Staffordshire programme.*

In August we were able to announce that about 150 premises in the Blackshaw Moor community were able to access fibre broadband.

Local county councillor and Staffordshire's rural affairs leader Gill Heath said:

"It's pleasing to see that Blackshaw Moor properties can now access faster broadband speeds. There are a number of businesses in the area which will benefit, as well as hundreds of residents. This is a real step forward for the village."

# Women and Broadband Challenge

**Staffordshire County Council has been awarded £67,000 after Superfast Staffordshire made a successful bid for funding to Broadband Delivery UK and the Government Equalities Office.**

The grant is to run a Women and Broadband Challenge project in the Superfast Staffordshire rollout area between now and March 2015. The Women and Broadband Challenge will target both existing business women and women who are thinking about going into business and will give them the skills to maximize the business opportunities that fibre broadband offers.

Women in Rural Enterprise (WiRE), based at Harper Adams University, has been appointed to run the project. WiRE will be working closely with other local delivery partners at the Chamber of Commerce and Simply Staffordshire.

Polly Gibb, WiRE director said:

“This is a great opportunity for women of all ages to come along, learn new skills and boost their confidence in using online technology. You don’t have to be a business owner already – you might be considering starting a business or thinking about returning to work after a career break. We want everyone to feel welcome and we will be encouraging everyone to ask questions and have a go in an open and friendly environment.

## What's my Exchange and Cabinet number?

***Here's an easy way of checking where your exchange is and which cabinet number you're connected to. You can also check whether or not you can access fibre broadband.***

A simple way of checking is by using the following link to the BT Broadband Availability Checker.

Enter your telephone number or postcode where directed and it will tell you which exchange and cabinet you are connected to.

If you are still unsure about whether fibre is available in your area, please email your postcode to [superfast@staffordshire.gov.uk](mailto:superfast@staffordshire.gov.uk)

Please remember that your broadband service will not be upgraded automatically. You'll need to contact one of the many fibre broadband suppliers to find out what they're offering.
